

Thursday 1 June 2023

In the classroom: This week in English in Jen's class, the children finished their letters to the editor about the threats faced by koalas and how we can help, while Nicky's class used descriptive sentences to describe a character from a book. In Maths, Jen's class was exploring different strategies for addition and how we would count if we lived in the world of The Simpsons (base 8) and Nicky's class worked on learning to times numbers by 10 and how to manipulate shapes by sliding, flipping and rotating. In Science, the students had their minds blown away as they delved deeper into their unit on Space. This week they have investigated the Earth, Sun and Moon size and the distance between them. In Mindfulness, the children discussed the importance of taking care of themselves.



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
